Internet safety concerns

We have had some reported incidents of Fenton pupils using social media sites such as Instagram, Snap chat, Facebook, You Tube and Tictok, out of school. This has also included some reported issues with pupils being unkind to each other and swearing. All of these sites are not suitable for primary aged children which is why they have an age restriction of 13.

Children are taught this in Esafety lessons at school and also by our local police officer PC Thomas. We ask that you please reinforce this at home by not allowing children access to these sites until they reach the appropriate age.

Attendance matters—be on time for school every day. Every second late is a missed learning opportunity and may mean that your child struggles with reading, spelling, maths or behaviour.
